Civil Service Employees

The total number of civil service employees in the fourth quarter of 2019 has been reported as 403,772 persons, of which 78 percent were male and 22 percent were female. This figure shows 0.8 percent increase compared to the same period of the last year.

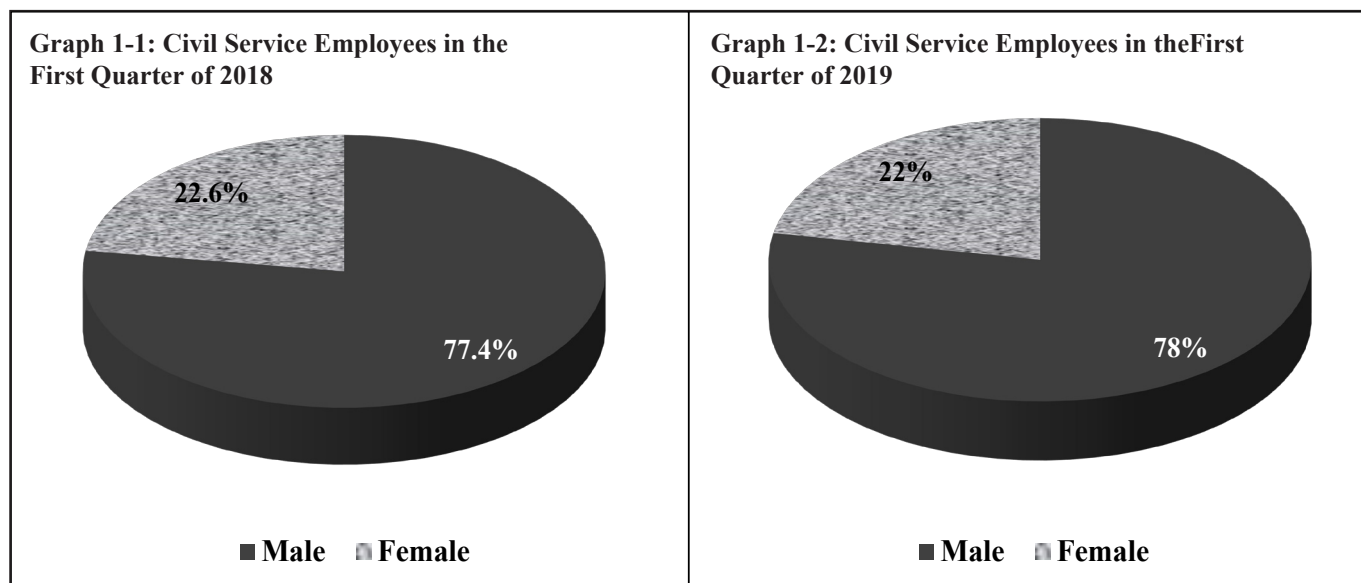

Health Facilities in the Country

According to the data collected on health Sector during the 1th quarter of 2019 shows that there were 173 government and 364 private hospitals in the country. There is an increase in the government and private hospitals by 1.1 and 1.8 percent respectively compared to the 1th quarter of 2018.

In the 1th quarter 2019, there were 446 comprehensive health centers, 984 basic health center and 1,046 health sub centers which compared to previous 1th quarter of 2018 shows 2.8, 1.4 and 2.5 percent increase in the number of comprehensive health centers, basic health centers and sub health centers respectively.

The number of government laboratories in the 1th quarter of 2019 was 1,305 and private laboratories were 1,521 which shows 33.4 and 3.8 percent increase in the government laboratories and private laboratories respectively compared to the 1th quarter of 2018.

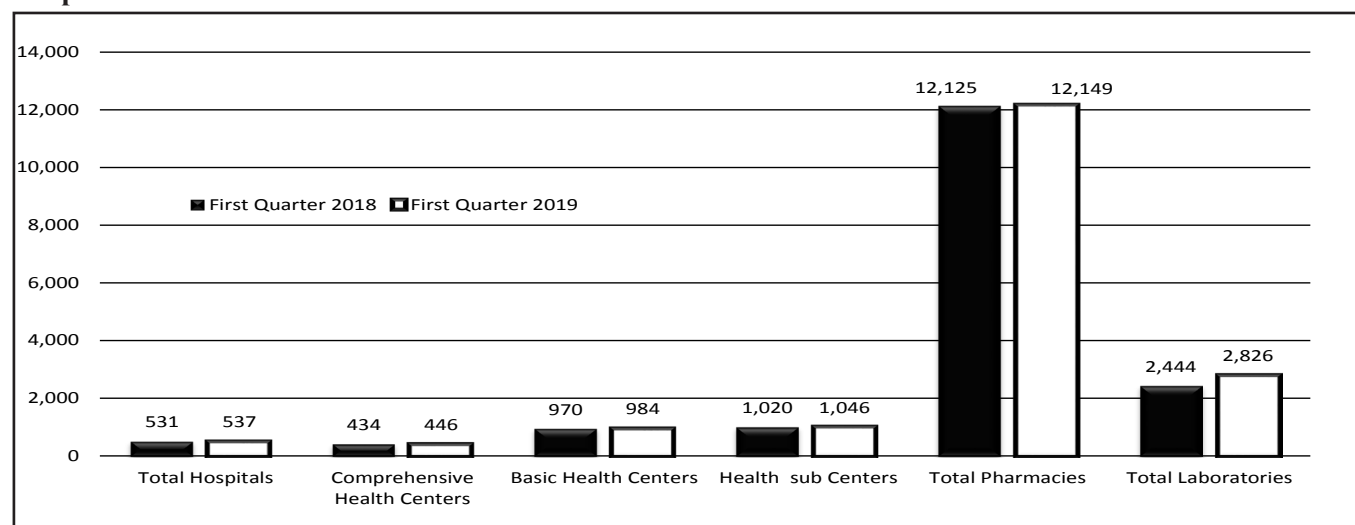

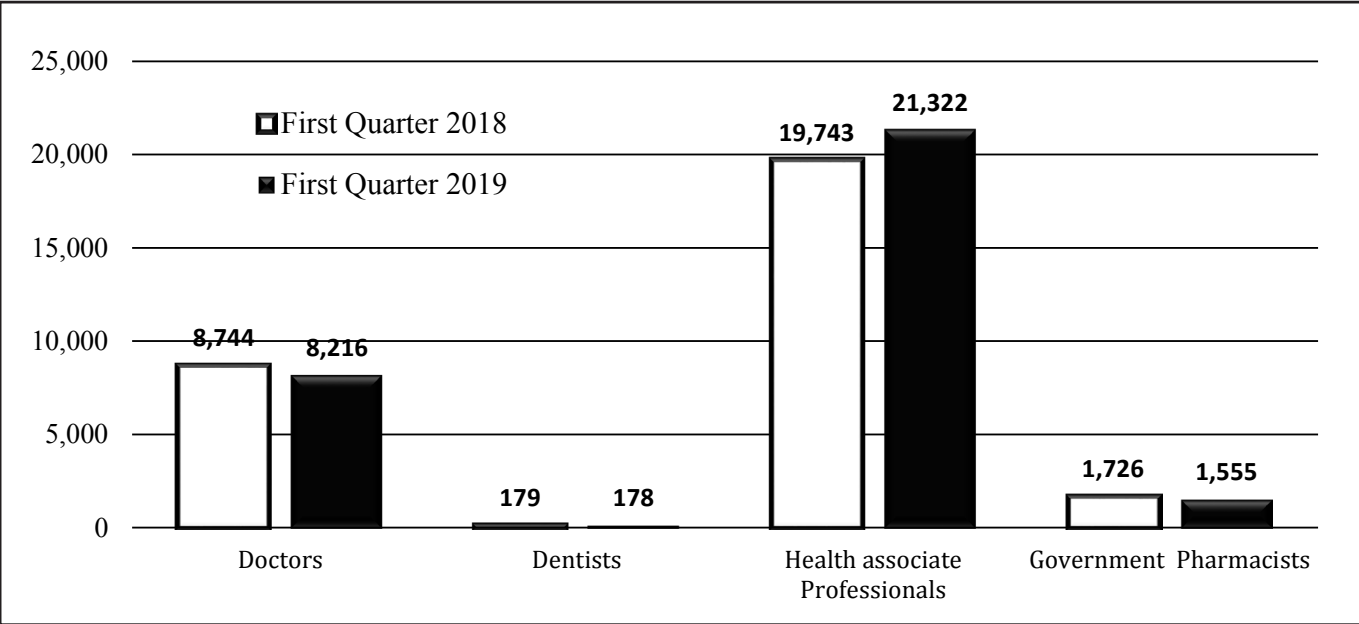

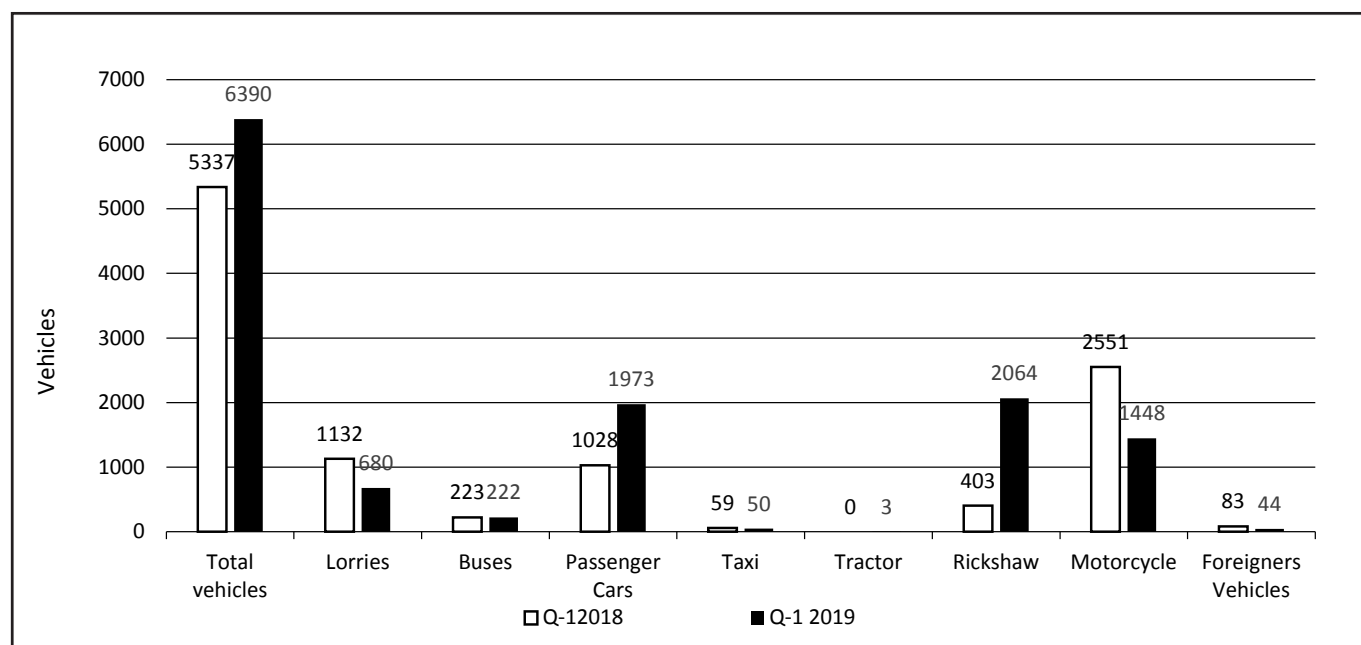

Mining

Afghanistan is rich in mineral resources and offers potential for considerable future development. Coal, natural gas, salt, marble, liquid ammonia has been commercially exploited in the past. There are deposits of iron, barites, and significant reserves of copper and some oil reserves. Total value of mining production in the fourth quarter of 2019 increased by 11.2 % compared to the fourth quarter of 2018.

Electricity

Electricity production in the country is being produced by hydro, diesel, and thermal powers. Afghanistan has potentially a rich resource of hydroelectric .In the third quarter of 2019 electricity production decreased by 8.8% compared to third quarter 2018.

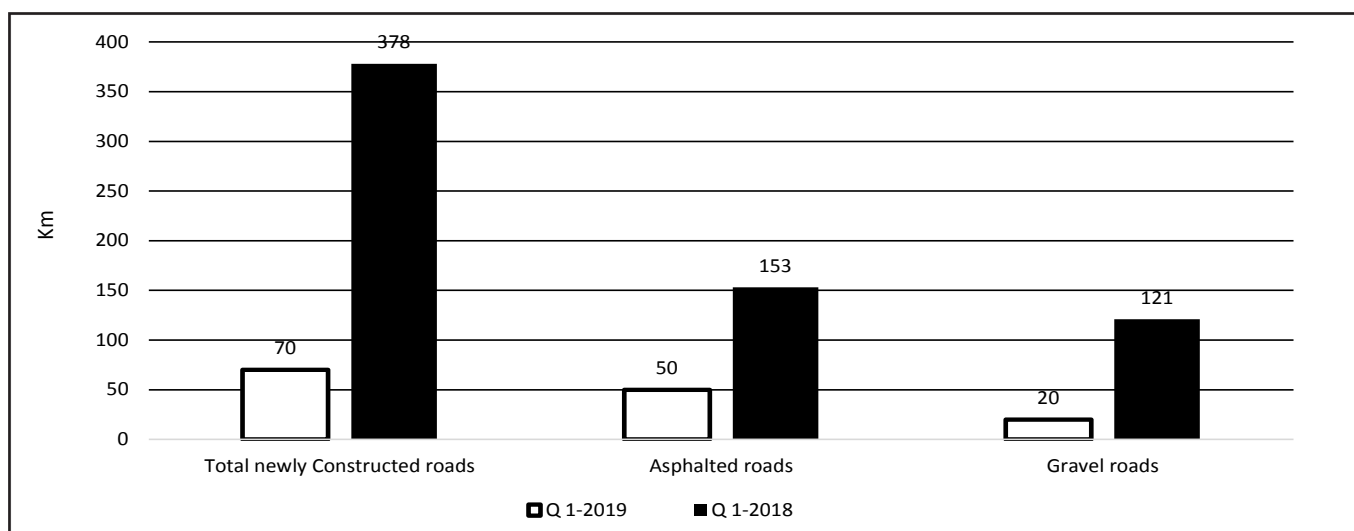

Exports, Free on Board (FOB)

The officially recorded export of goods was around US\$ 182.6 million during the first quarter of 2019, which does not include smuggling and re-export.

It is worth nothing that in the first quarter of 2019 exports of dry and fresh fruits constitutes 45.1 percent of exports and that of medical herbs constitute 24.0 percent of the total exports of the country. In the first quarter of 2019, exports of Minerals compared to the first quarter of 2018 increased by 36.2 percent.

It has to be mentioned that during the first quarter of 2019 the value of Re-Export is US\$ 2.5 million from all boundaries of Afghanistan.

Imports, including Cost Insurance Freight (CIF)

The officially recorded import of goods in the first quarter of 2019 was US\$ 1.79 billion excluding smuggling and duty-free goods.

Registered imports in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the first quarter of 2018 decreased by 7.8 percent (from US\$ 1.94 billion to US\$ 1.79 billion).the data shows that the main imports include Wheat and wheat flour, petroleum and lubricants, machinery, vehicles and spare parts, metal products, fabric and vegetable oil which constitutes 56.2 percent of total imports.

Duty free imports

The total duty free imports during the first quarter of 2019 was 466.0 million as compared to US\$ 495.1 million in the first quarter of 2018, which shows a decrease of 5.9 percent.

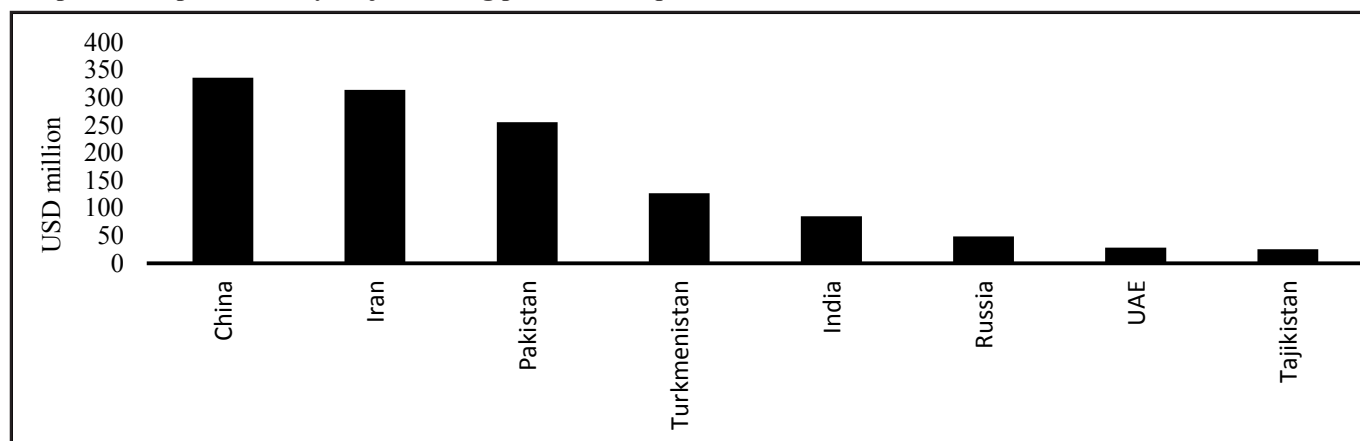

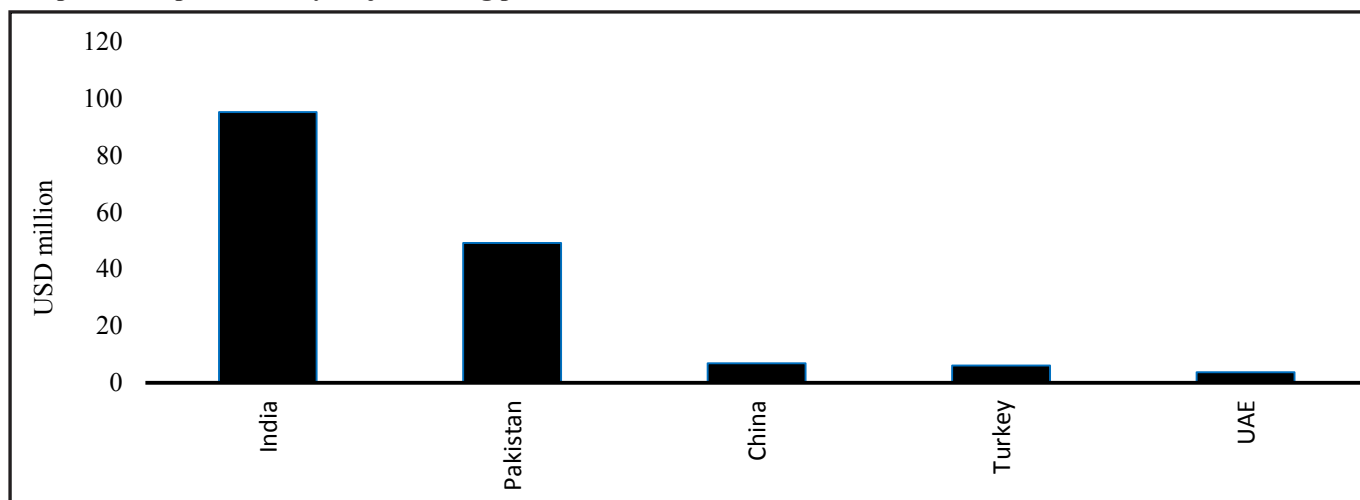

Graph 9-3: Expors, Imports and Trade balance

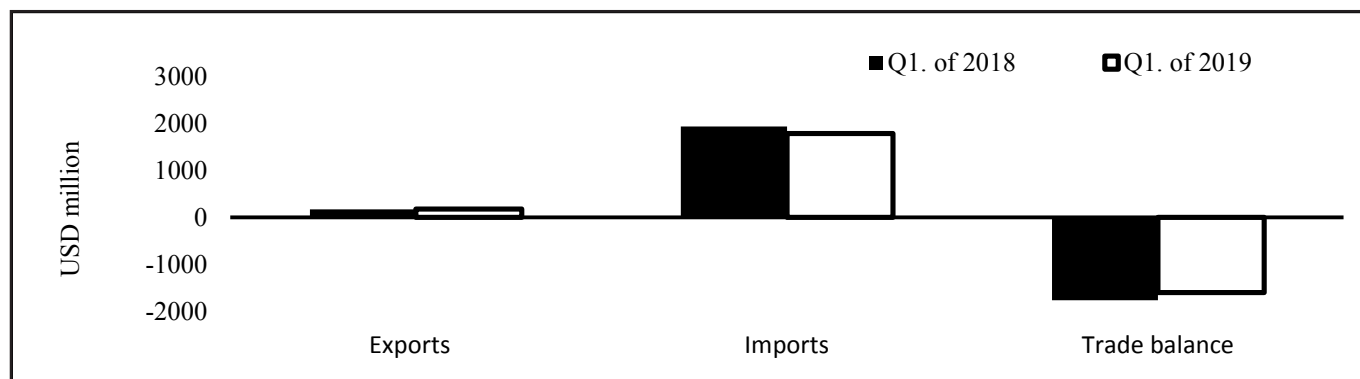

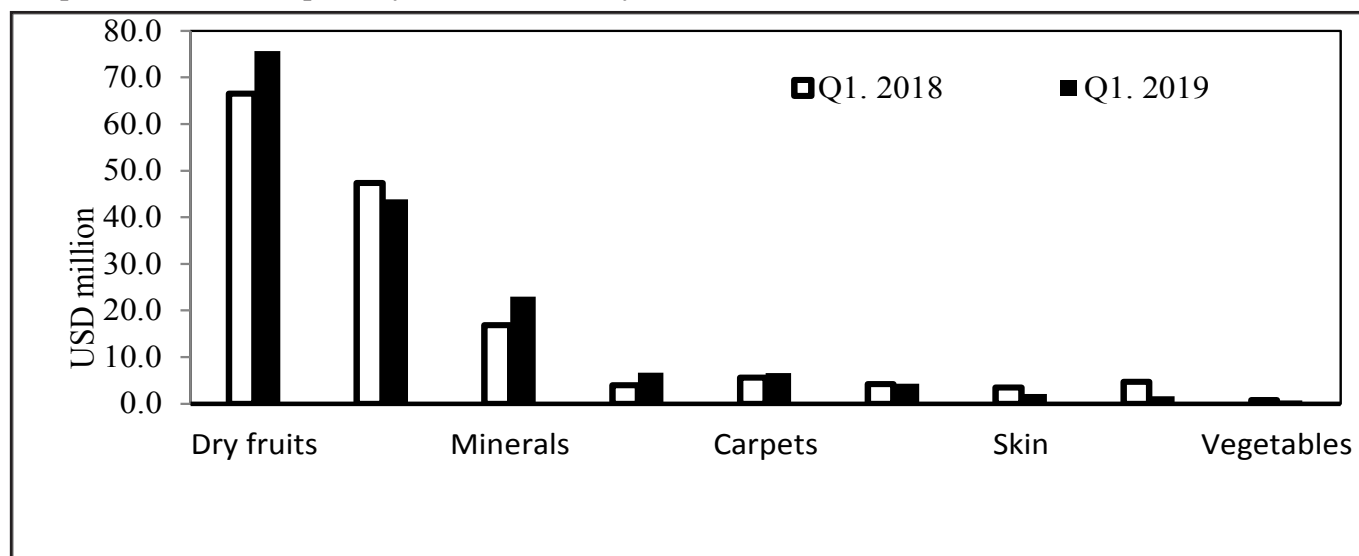
Graph 9-4: Value of Exports by Main Commodity

Graph 9-5: Expenses from Internal and External Resources in Development Projects - 1st Quarter, 2019

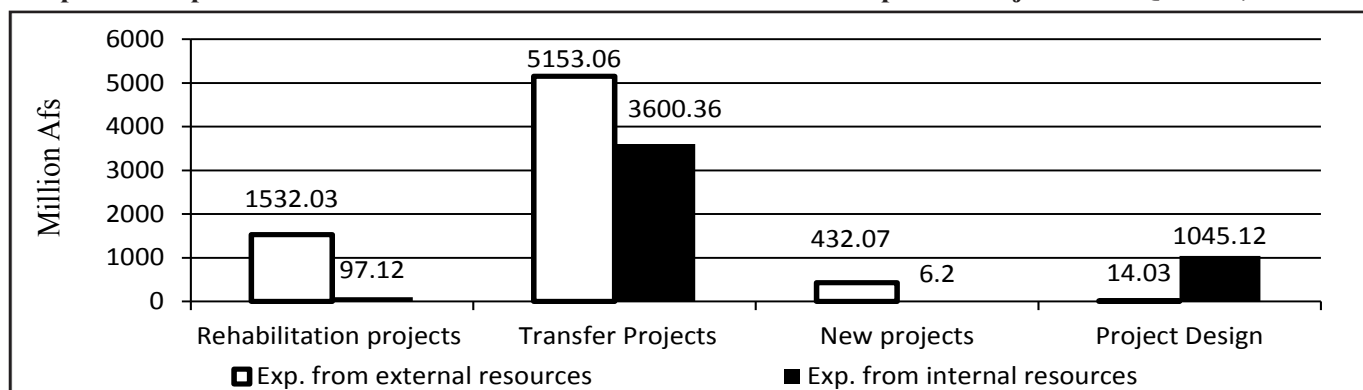

National CPI

The inflation rate measured by the overall consumer price index (CPI) for the country increased by 0.4 Percent in first quarter of 2019 compared to the fourth quarter of 2018. The inflation compared to first quarter of last year was 0.8 Percent. In the first quarter of 2019 the increases was in fruits, vegetables and spices prices in food items and transportation in non-food items.

Food Prices Index

The national overall price index for food items in the first quarter 2019 compared to the fourth quarter of 2018 had increased by 1.7 Percent. The main contributory factors was increase in fruits prices by 4.6 percent, vegetable by 9.7 percent and spices by 5.7%.

Non-Food Prices Index

The national non-food prices decreased by 0.9 percent in first quarter 2019 compared to the fourth quarter of 2018. The decrease mainly was in transportation prices by 3.4 percent.

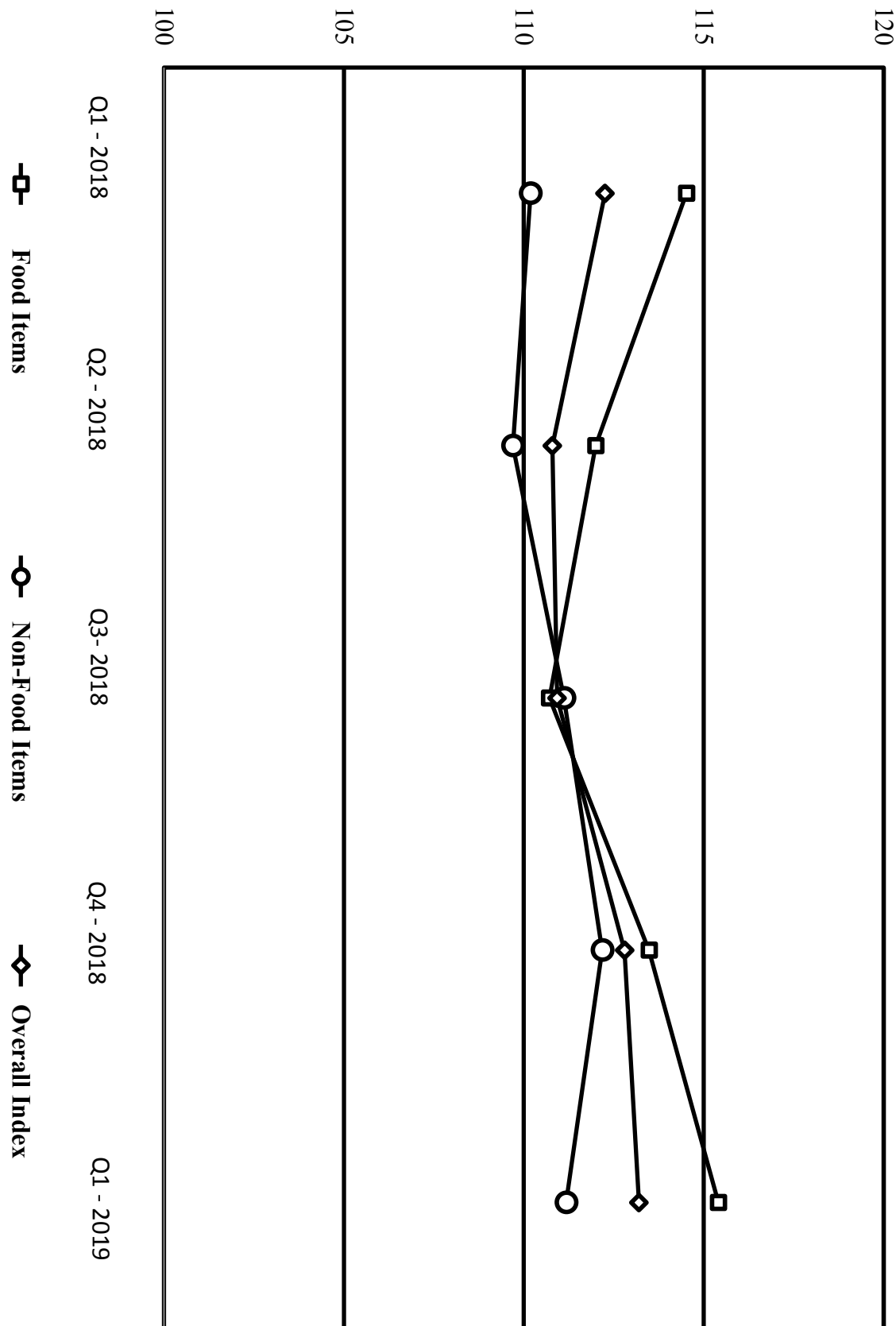

Graph 10-2: National CPI & Kabul CPI Quarterly Inflation (% Change to Previous Quarter)

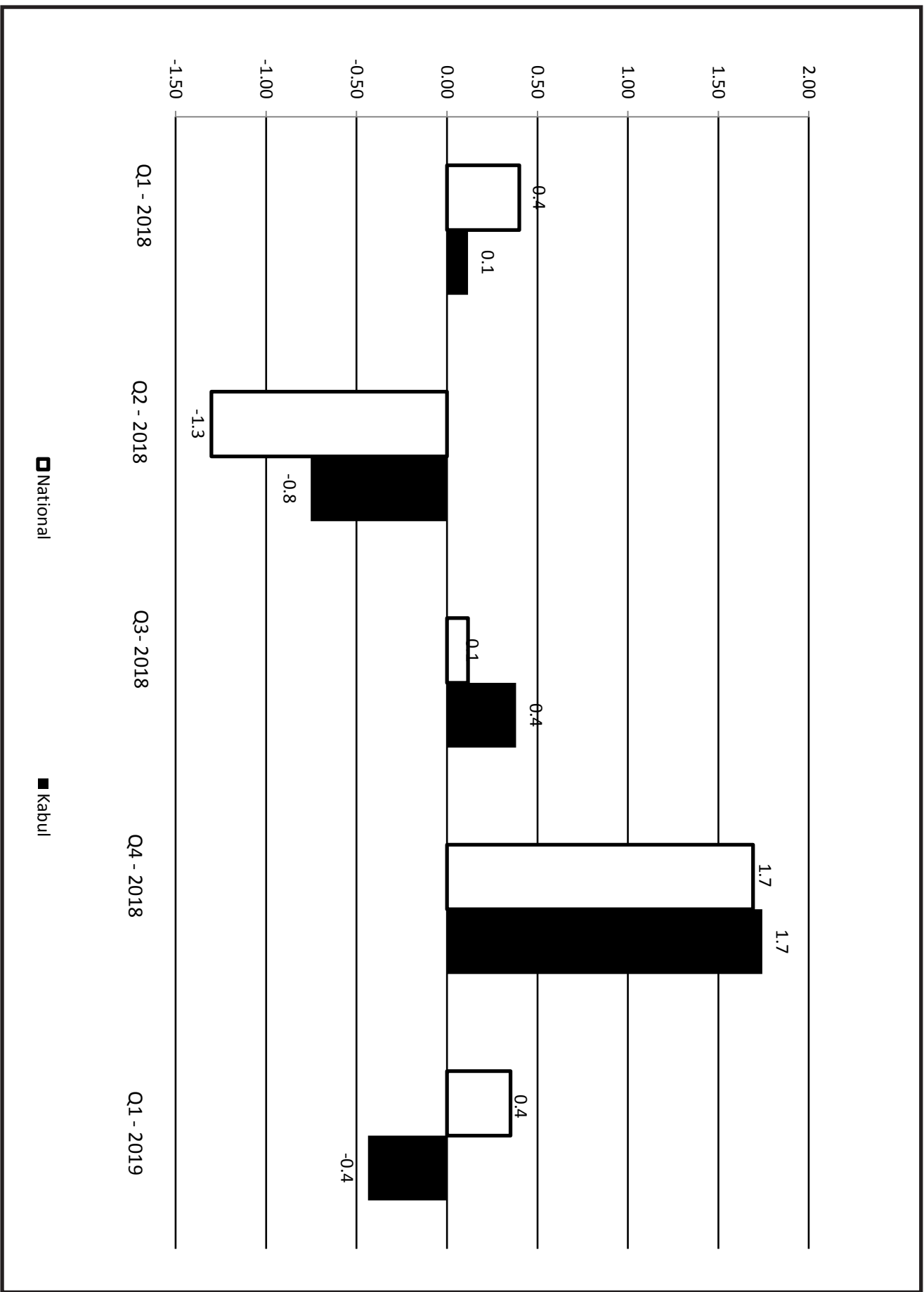
